PE and School Sport Premium – Reporting, July 2026

From September 2017, schools will receive a share of £300m per year, jointly funded by The Departments for Education, Health and Culture and Media and Sport. This Physical Education and Sport Premium funding is ring-fenced and must be used to provide sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and Sport in school. Each school receives £16,000 plus £10 per pupil in Y1-Y6.

Key Outcome Indicators

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, kick-starting healthy and active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and School Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Academic Year 2025-2026

We had approximately 270 pupils in Y1-Y6 and received £18,710 of PE and Sport Premium funding for the 2025-2026 academic year.
